



In Person Learning for High Needs Students Update

Lawrence Alliance for Education

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January 13, 2021

Given continued HIGH RATES of Community Spread in Lawrence, the return of selected HIGH NEEDS students is planned as a <u>very</u> limited and controlled phased-in approach:

- ENHANCED PPE and PROTOCOLS will be in place including:
 - In Person Training for returning Staff from Registered Nurses
 - Daily temperature checks for students during arrival
 - Use of Abbott Binax Now Rapid Antigen Test for symptomatic staff and students
 - Use of LARGE CLASSROOMS with student and staff assignment limits
 - Breakfast/Lunch in the classroom
 - Daily facility cleaning along with twice weekly DEEP CLEANING protocols
 - Abundance of hand sanitizer along with frequent hand washing with soap and water
 - Protocols for arrival, passing through the school, and dismissal to maintain social distancing
 - Minimize additional staff and visitors in the buildings
 - Face Shields/Gloves for students and staff needing to be in close proximity
 - Limited Mask breaks as needed throughout the day

- STAFF were matched from a pool of volunteers who responded to a survey on DEC 1^{st.}
- Personal invitations were provided to Families of selected HIGH NEEDS students.
- Week of Jan 11th: Principals are leading INFORMATIONAL ZOOM SESSIONS for families and staff of all returning students

- Interested Staff were matched with high needs student groups
- For Phase 1, preference was given to schools with readiness to invite <u>SPECIAL</u> <u>EDUCATION DISTRICT PROGRAMS</u> (ILP, PA1, PA2, MSS, PG1, PG2)
- IF these schools also included interest from ESL teachers, offers were extended to English Learner Newcomers
- For Phases 2 and 3, matches will include the return of additional High Needs students including: Pre-Kindergarten, Kindergarten and additional Special Education /Newcomer groups
- Principals will also be encouraged to provide matched assignments for homeless students or those living in Foster Care as well as additional High Needs students
- The schedule for In-Person return will be MON FRI 8:00 AM 1:30 PM (GR 1-8)
 MON FRI 8:30 AM 2:30 PM (GR 9-12)

ACCESS Test Administration In Person

What: ACCESS for ELLs is a statewide English language proficiency test that measures students' academic English language skills in four domains (Listening, Reading, Writing and Speaking)

<u>When</u>: In a typical year January – February. This year the window has been extended from January into May.

Who: All students coded as English Learners in grades K-12. There are approximately 4,560 ELs across our 32 schools.

<u>How</u>: We are working with schools on implementation plans. Schools will follow all Health and Safety protocols established for in person learning.
