# Highlights & Updates













### Year-to-Date Metrics

- District
  - Total enrollment 13,775; multilingual 5,457; special education 2,643
  - Attendance rate through April 28th: 89.4%
  - Last day of school: June 14th
  - First day of school for 23-24 School Year is August 28th
- Family Experience Questionnaire feedback
  - 83% of caregivers rate their school at good/excellent in communications (4,559)
  - 89.5% of caregivers report that their student likes to participate in school and school activities
  - 79.2% of caregivers indicate that their student has a at least one trusted adult at school to discuss concerns with
  - 86% of caregivers agree/strongly agree they are involved in determining the services their child receives at school
  - 87% of caregivers say that teachers and staff are working to build positive relationships with them
- School Quality Review Indicator 4: Positive Learning Environment (School Culture) Maintain a culture of mutual trust and positive attitudes that equitably supports the academic and personal growth of students and adults
  - Detailed report will be presented to the LAE at June 2023 meeting
  - "Proficient" rating: Behind the approach to culture building and aligns family outreach and student learning experiences to the desired outcomes, resulting in the majority of stakeholders embodying the desired school culture
  - "Well developed" rating: Building approach and strategically align family outreach and student learning experiences to the desired outcomes, resulting in the vast majority of the stakeholders embodying the desired school culture
  - Currently of the 30 schools that have received their report, 4 have been rated "well developed" and 24 have been rated "proficient"




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
## School Site Changes Next Year

- The High School Learning Center will move to the swing space at 1 Parker St (324 students). It is currently located at LHS Campus. Building design aligns well with HLC programmatic structure.
- ENLACE & International programs will merge and move to LHS Campus (455 students). They are currently located at the North Common Education Complex (NCEC, a.k.a the old high school) at 233 Haverhill St. This improves access for our recently arrived students to all elective and extracurricular opportunities available at LHS Campus.
- The Leahy School will be moving to the NCEC 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> floors (389 students). They are currently located at the Parker Street swing space. NCEC location is less than a mile from regular Leahy location and has served as bus shuttle location for Leahy students this year, so families are very familiar with the site. Classrooms are larger and more traditional.
