New Superintendent Induction Program

- A program run through the Massachusetts Association of School Superintendents.
- Successful former superintendents mentor educators new to the superintendent role
- Six hours monthly coaching along with in person and Zoom sessions.

Empowering new superintendents to accelerate student learning through strategic leadership

As the district's leader, each Massachusetts superintendent has the opportunity and responsibility to work through school principals and others to improve academic, social and emotional outcomes for all youth. The three-year New Superintendent Induction Program (NSIP) provides a firm foundation for new superintendents to do so with greater skill, savvy and success. NSIP is a collaboration between the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (ESE) and the Massachusetts Association of School Superintendents (MASS). By teaching replicable best practices, providing expert coaching that goes well beyond mentoring, and offering multiple opportunities for deep collaboration with peers, NSIP helps superintendents sharpen their focus on teaching and learning, transform their visions into positive student outcomes, and become successful instructional leaders capable of promoting substantive and realistic change at the school level.



Facilities Update

- During the week of 9/5 we had several schools affected by the elevated temperatures
- Our facilities team secured additional portable air conditioner units to supply 4 classrooms at the Hennessey, 3rd floor classrooms at LFPA, and also the Breen
- We had leadership team members visit schools that do not have air conditioning to check on building temperatures and to speak with staff, students, and families
- The rationale of our current building projects and ESSER HVAC upgrades is to assure that all of our students have temperature appropriate learning environments.
- Recent and current HVAC upgrades that support temp controls include the Frost, Leonard, South Lawrence East, and Arlington.
- Upcoming upgrades are in process for the Breen, Tarbox, NCEC, and the Bruce in the spring and summer.



General Updates

- Nutrition Services served over 93,000 meals to school aged children over the summer
- Several of our graduates received scholarships from Keolis
- LHS Track showed up en masse at the Groundworks Lawrence 5k
- 43 Students participated in Junior Police Academy with our School Resource Officer Unit
- LPS registration teams worked over the summer enrolling new students
 - Prek team completed 167
 - K-8 team completed 873
 - High school completed 165
 - o 13,220 students enrolled as of September 6
 - Multilingual Students 4,925
 - Special Education 2,535

Transportation Update

- We are happy to say we have a Transportation Manager, Naomi De la Cruz
- LPS transports over 3,100 students daily
- During the summer, we conducted a minitransportation audit, calling 40 families who received transportation to gauge their satisfaction level
- We will monitor pickup locations and pickup times for families who did not indicate full satisfaction
- We conducted bus stop checks to assure buses were arriving on time and at correct pickup locations
- This was done for individual and group pickup locations





Human Resources Update

- Assistant Superintendent overseeing HR transitioned to the Lynn Public Schools in July
- We currently have 55 teaching vacancies
- HR has processed 387 hires through September 5
- We are offering sign-on bonus for all staff and referral bonuses to eligible staff who refer new teachers
- New Teacher Orientation on August 23 included required training and also distribution of 152 laptops for new hires
- Our all-staff Opening Day ceremony was MC'd by our Lancer Cheer squad, who brought tremendous energy, as well as performances by Summer Music Students
