Minutes of the Lawrence Alliance for Education Board – LAE

The Lawrence Alliance for Education Board meeting was held in person at the South Lawrence East Educational Complex Auditorium with the following members present: Edgar De Leon, Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Director at Noble and Greenough School, Mayor Brian de Pena, Dr. Dolores Calaf, Early Childhood and K-12 Education, and Consultant with Community Collaborative, Maria Moeller, CEO/The Community Group, Patricia Mariano, Chair. Absent: Juana Matias, Regional Administrator for the New England Regional Office, U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD

Also in person was Interim Superintendent Juan Rodriguez, and Maria L. Campusano, Recording Secretary for this meeting.

Chair Mariano, called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. The Chair introduced and welcomed Dr. Dolores Calaf to the LAE board who expressed being invited to be part of the board an important aspect for her as part of lawrence for over 30 years, but also because of her believe that education open doors from the moment we are born we need excitement in learning and discovering; thus, hoping that through the school system this message is conveyed to all students and parents. Public comment: Chair Mariano explained what the expectation of public participation is and how it is conducted, she called the following:

- Homayoun Maali, 53 Chester Street, Lawrence, MA. Expressed that while the search of a
 permanent superintendent, the priority should be supporting the teachers and their union who
 are helping the students get their education; Mr. Maali referred to a quote from Nelson
 Mandela, "Education is indeed the most powerful weapon to change the world" indicating that to
 do this we need to support the teachers and not to allow other cities to take the teachers with
 better wages.
- Jonathan Guzman, Vice Chair of the Lawrence School Committee, 39 Lynn St, Lawrence, MA. Expressed that since the creation of the LAE, it has always been the subject of the open meeting law since powers from the school committee were taken away; asking why the bylaws got accepted on February 12, 2018 when the first meeting was on February 25, 2018. further expressing that it should be a proven record of working with underperforming schools. He added that under chapter 69:1 K clearly gives the board full power of the school committee including hiring, suspending a superintendent, creating policies for jobs etc. Mr. Guzman explained that during the March 28th meeting, Julia Silverio, former member, implied that the board does not have a say on implementation of policies and further expressed that the development process of the hiring superintendent should begin already.
