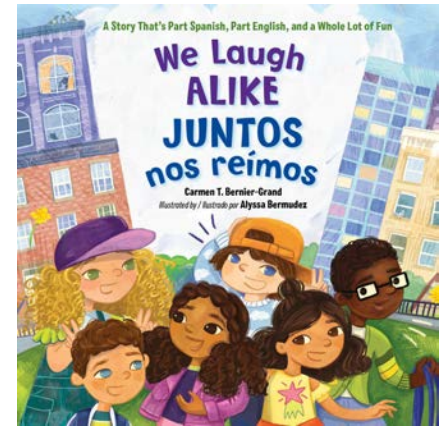
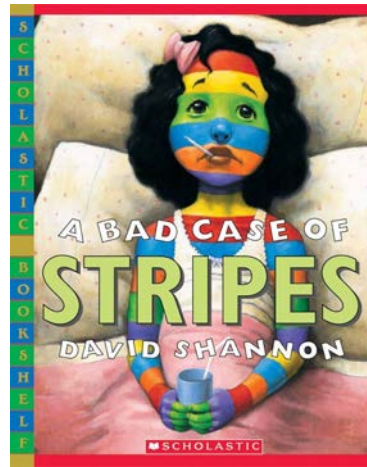
Summer Reading Lists

The 2024 LPS Summer Reading list is ready!

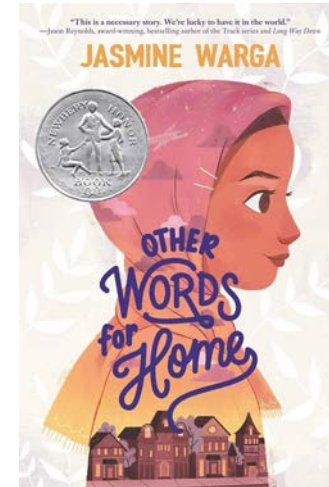
- The list will be posted on the LPS website and shared with Lawrence Public Library in June

- Held at the PAC, it is a great opportunity, especially for younger students, to perform in such a large venue for the first time



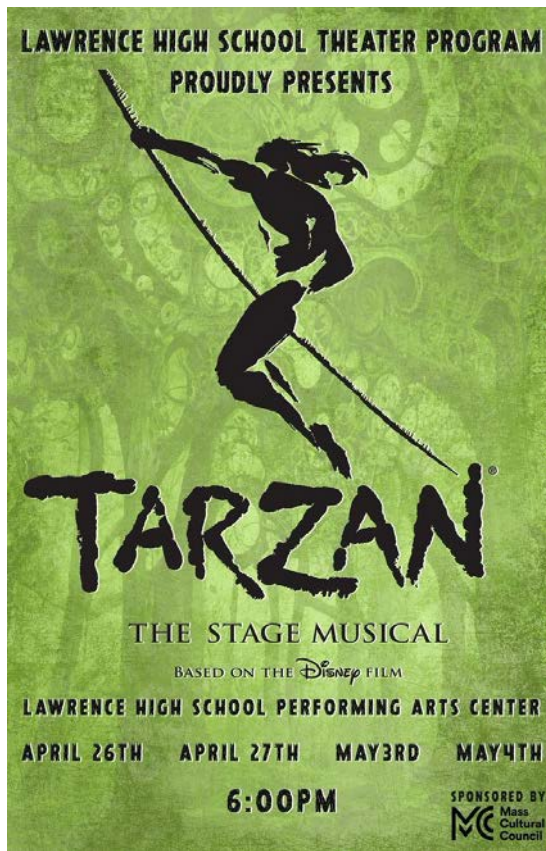
Homeland Security at LHS

- They received citations for their efforts and posed for a photo with City Councilors



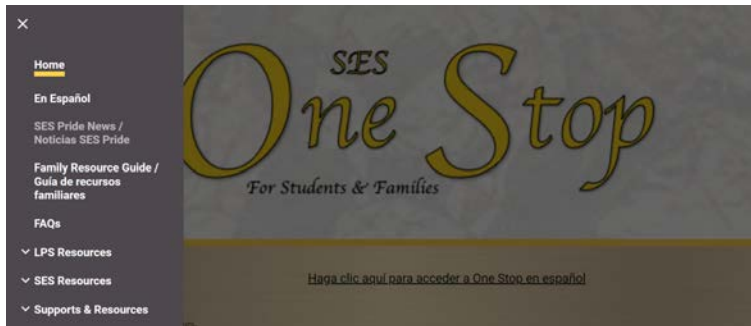
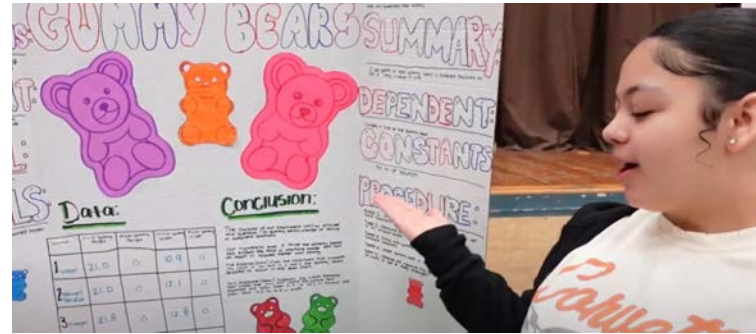
Spring Sports in Action

- All episodes can be found on the One Stop Hub for Students and Families



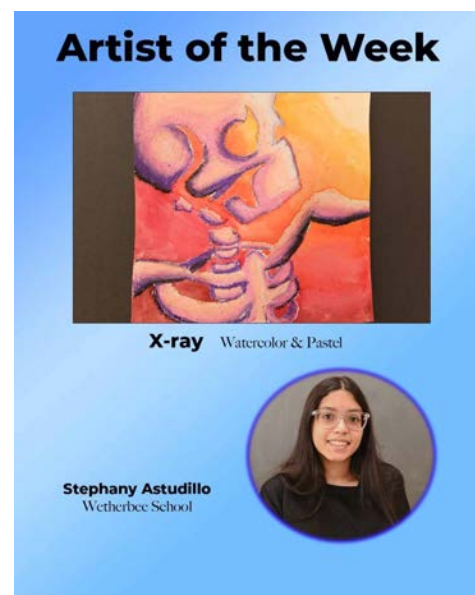
Student Voice: The Leonard Middle School Think Tank!

- They have contributed ideas to the Leahy School Project including the room colors for the middle school section of the building



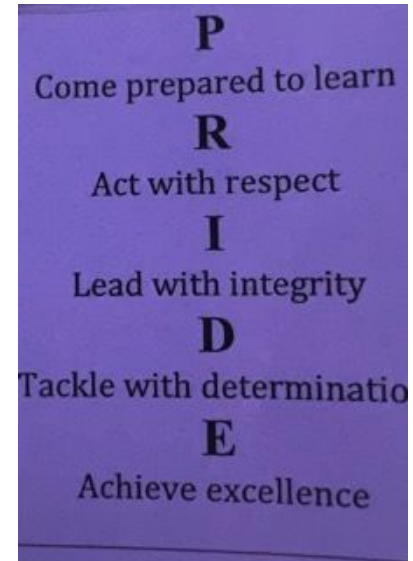
Student Voice Through Art!
